

From The Pastor's Desk

RESILIENCE



Beloved Church Family:

We bring you Calvary's greetings knowing we have celebrated the resurrection of our Lord and savior earlier on this spring. Now that summer is around the corner it is good to remind ourselves that summer time is one of the busiest time of the year with gardening, graduations, vacations, weddings, and family re-unions to attend. All these require not only careful planning because they can become stressful due to emptiness from unfulfilled goals. The need for resilience to bounce back is imperative. Disappointments in the Christendom or in our Christian journey leads to fatigue and discouragements, and hence we require resilience to bounce back into healthy growth just like all the plants bounce back into healthy growth in summer after dormancy during the winter and renewed growth of spring.

In this 2016 summer issue of our Careshare Newsletter, Mt. Traveler, let us focus and reflect on the word **RESILIENCE**. Resilience is the ability to recover from setbacks, adapt well to change, and keep going in the face of adversity. Within Christian organizations there are setbacks, adversities and changes in our lives because we are engaged in a spiritual warfare. Resilience is therefore necessary because you have to bounce back to normal spiritual growth. You cannot afford to dwell on your setback or adversity and wallow in your self-pity party. You have to rebound into healthy normal spiritual growth through your resilience.

The building blocks for resilience are positive emotion, engagement, relationships, meaning, and accomplishment. Positive emotion is love because love is of God. Love requires that you rebound to normal spiritual growth by forgiving one another even as God for Christ's sake has forgiven you. The ability to forgive is prove of your love for God and that you have faith in Him that He is able to do what He said He would do.

Positive engagement involves obedience to God's word knowing that you are in a spiritual warfare. Of course, the weapons of our warfare are not carnal but spiritual. This is why every Christian needs to always take the whole armor of God because the war we are engaged in is a spiritual warfare (Ephesians 6:10-18). Each time you overcome the devil, stand at a ready mood for your adversary the Devil is seeking an opportune time like a roaring lion seeking whom he may devour. Worst still the devil also comes as an angel of light!

Positive relationships are very vital to becoming resilient. Positive relationships are built by trusting Jesus Christ as Lord and savior. When you are a believer in Jesus, you have joined a movement of trust: trusting Christ and trusting other believers. Each time you succumb to the temptation to distrust or doubt Christ or other believers, you fall out this positive relationship. Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not


REVEREND RICHARD D. JACOBS ORDAINED

Reverend Richard D. Jacobs, a native of Munford, Alabama became a member of Mt. Traveler Baptist Church on January 15, 2006 while attending Auburn University and has served faithfully since that time. He was then licensed an Evangelist as his calling ministry on November 27, 2011 and has continued to serve faithfully as the Coordinator of the Evangelism and Outreach Ministry. In April 2012, he married former Khady Berthe and they are now proud parents of one daughter, Amila Christinie Jacobs.

Reverend Jacobs has a diploma in Pastoral and Christian leadership (April 2015) and an advance diploma in Mission and Evangelism (November, 2015), both from the Christian Leadership Institute. On Sunday afternoon, April 24, 2016, Mt. Traveler Missionary Baptist Church was the setting for the Ordination Service for Reverend Jacobs. Jacobs parents (Brother Ray and Sister Stephanie Jacobs).

We are grateful to the guest speaker for the ordination service, Reverend E. L. Jacobs, Pastor of Union Springs Missionary Baptist Church, Talladega, Alabama, who is also the cousin of Rev. Richard Jacobs. We also wish to thank the Union Springs Baptist Church choir and congregation for their attendance and support. In Reverend E. L. Jacobs' message to Rev. Richard Jacobs, he suggested four (4) primary thoughts to always remember: stay humble, remain teachable, be wise, continue to learn from your mentors and know how to apply God's wisdom to your life.
